
BACKGROUND

On March 17, 2022, the City Council selected Map 101 as the new Council District boundaries and introduced Ordinance No. 2022-05. The Recommended Action is to finalize the new Council District boundaries by adopting Ordinance No. 2022-05 and adopting Resolution No. 2022-25. This action insures that the City meets the statutory deadline of April 17, 2022 for adoption of the new Council Districts following the 2020 Decennial Census and submission to the Riverside County Registrar of Voters.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-05

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF JURUPA VALLEY,
CALIFORNIA, ADJUSTING THE BOUNDARIES OF
THE FIVE CITY COUNCIL DISTRICTS AND
ADOPTING A NEW OFFICIAL COUNCIL DISTRICT
MAP FOR THE CITY OF JURUPA VALLEY BASED ON
THE RESULTS OF THE 2020 DECENNIAL CENSUS
AND AMENDING SECTION 2.05.070**

**THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JURUPA VALLEY DOES
ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. Findings. The City Council of the City of Jurupa Valley does find determine and declare as follows:

(a) On August 3, 2017 the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 2017-12 pursuant to Government Code Sections 34871 to add Chapter 2.05 to the Jurupa Valley Municipal Code to provide for the by-district election of members of the City Council, adopt the official Council District Map for the City of Jurupa Valley, establish the boundaries and identification number of each electoral district, and establish a sequencing of elections for each Council District.

(b) Pursuant to Elections Code Section 21601 and Section 2.05.100 of the Jurupa Valley Municipal Code, the City Council is required to adjust the boundaries of any or all of the Council Districts following each decennial federal census. Using the census as a basis, the City Council must adjust the boundaries so that the Council Districts are as nearly equal in population as practicable and in compliance with all applicable provisions of law, including the United States and Federal Constitutions and the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965 (52 U.S.C. Section 10301 et seq.).

(c) In accordance with Elections Code Section 21607 and 21607.1, the City Council held public hearings on the drawing of district boundaries on: October 21, 2021; December 2, 2021; February 17, 2022; and March 17, 2022. The proposed maps of the district boundaries were published on the City's redistricting webpage on February 10, 2022. At each of the foregoing hearings, the public was invited to provide input on the composition of the new Council District boundaries. Additionally, the City held a public outreach workshop on January 6, 2022.

(d) After closing the public hearing held on March 17, 2022, the City Council selected the map depicted in Exhibit "A" of this Ordinance as the official Council District Map for the City of Jurupa Valley and introduced this Ordinance for first reading. Demographic data supporting the map based on the 2020 Census is attached hereto as Exhibit "B" of this Ordinance and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. Adoption of New Council District Map. The map attached hereto as Exhibit "A" to this Ordinance, and incorporated herein by this reference, is hereby approved and adopted as

the Official Council District Map for the City of Jurupa Valley and shall be used in the 2022 general municipal election and all such elections for City Council thereafter, until further amended.

Section 3. Amendment of Section 2.05.070. Section 2.050.070 of Chapter 2.05 of the Jurupa Valley Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

“2.05.070. - City Council districts established.

Five (5) City Council districts are hereby established in the city. The boundaries and identifying number of each district shall be as described on the official "Council District Map" as adopted by Ordinance No. 2022-05 on file in the Office of the City Clerk.”

Section 4. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall nonetheless remain in full force and effect. The City Council of the City of Jurupa Valley hereby declares that it would have adopted each section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases, or portions of this Ordinance be declared invalid or unenforceable.

Section 5. Certification. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance and shall cause the same to be published in the manner prescribed by law. This Ordinance shall be effective upon its adoption pursuant to Elections Code Section 21600, et seq, Government Code Section 36937(a) and applicable law.



**THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JURUPA VALLEY DOES
RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. Findings. The City Council of the City of Jurupa Valley does find determine and declare as follows:

The proposed maps of the district boundaries were published on the City's redistricting webpage on February 10, 2022. At each of the foregoing hearings, the public was invited to provide input on the composition of the new Council District boundaries. Additionally, the City held a public outreach workshop on January 6, 2022.

(d) After closing the public hearing held on March 17, 2022, the City Council selected the map depicted in Exhibit "A" of this Resolution as the official Council District Map for the City of Jurupa Valley. Demographic data supporting the map based on the 2020 Census is attached hereto as Exhibit "B" of this Resolution and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. Adoption of New Council District Map. The map attached hereto as Exhibit "A" to this Resolution, and incorporated herein by this reference, is hereby approved and adopted as the Official Council District Map for the City of Jurupa Valley and shall be used in the 2022 general municipal election and all such elections for City Council thereafter, until further amended.

Section 3. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Resolution is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent

jurisdiction, the remaining portions of this Resolution shall nonetheless remain in full force and effect. The City Council of the City of Jurupa Valley hereby declares that it would have adopted each section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Resolution, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases, or portions of this Resolution be declared invalid or unenforceable

Section 4. Certification. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Resolution. This Resolution shall be effective upon its adoption.


